BRIEF OVERVIEW

The Purple Parade is a ground-up collaborative initiative by volunteer groups, supported by various community and corporate organisations and facilitated by the Central Singapore Community Development Council (CDC) and The Purple Parade Limited (TPPL).

Currently, the signature event of TPPL is The Purple Parade organised annually, usually in 4th quarter of each year.

The Purple Parade 2021 aimed to bring greater awareness to the public. It was opened to all who believe in the cause to show their support, either to parade, volunteer, showcase their abilities or simply to be present. Traditionally held on one day, at one location, the parade has grown from 3,000 to 10,000 in physical attendance in recent years.

Undaunted by Covid-19, the parade went hybrid with live and online performances, as well as campaigns. More than 20,000 rallied in a show of support for the cause.

Over the years, the Purple Parade have created opportunities for such displays through the 5C segments of Campaign, Carnival, Concert, Contingent and Conversations. The segments allow for an inclusive celebration of abilities as partners come together to show support for inclusion.



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ABOUT THE FIRST-EVER HYBRID EDITION OF THE PURPLE PARADE 2021

- The Purple Parade 2021 was a first-ever hybrid edition.
- The 2021 edition culminated with a **Livestream Concert** on **Saturday 30 October**, 3.00pm to 4.30pm. There was engagement and interaction with the broader community through multiple digital platforms, like Facebook, Instagram, and also through TPPL's website.
- The Livestream Concert at Suntec City was attended by:

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- The Livestream Concert, from 3.00pm to 4.45 pm, offered a programme of pre-recorded and live performances, as well as live chats with local celebrities and Paralympians, with giveaways to be won.
- Performances of the Concert included The Purple Symphony, Rare Disorders Society (Singapore), Very Special Arts Singapore, Singapore Association of the Visually Handicapped, APSN Delta Senior School, Diverse Abilities Dance Collective and Dance Spectrum International.
- There was also variety engagements by "Friends of People" and local celebrities such as Chew Chor Meng, Chen Han Wei and Evelyn Kok.
- The concert also featured 2 videos series:
 - "Celebrating Abilities of Local Heroes": Featuring Paralympians Yip Pin Xiu and Maximillian Tan; and
 - "Celebrating Abilities of Everyday Talents: Featuring Dancer Jaspreet, Illustrator Zi Yue, Model Zora and Musician Ming Yi.
- In addition, there are Human Library stories on The Purple Parade's website and Purple Conversation' live chat sessions for insightful and engaging conversations with People with Disabilities on their lived experiences.
- A new feature in 2021, a series of 'Walk in My Shoes' workshops, in collaboration with SPD, SADeaf and ARC, was mooted to create public awareness on the major disability groups through first-hand experience and perspectives.

 Parade, such as Yip Pin Xiu, Alister Ong and more.

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
A series of awareness building programmes were conducted beyond the month of October 2021:
